

Eizo Nagasaki

Former professor at the Faculty of Education, Graduate School of Education, Shizuoka University

Born in 1948 in Tokyo, Mr. Nagasaki joined the National Institute for Educational Policy Research (NIER) in 1980 after working as a junior high school teacher and became the Curriculum Director of the Curriculum Research Center of NIER in 2001. In 2009, Mr. Nagasaki became a graduate school professor at Shizuoka University and retired in 2014.

While at the Curriculum Research Center, Mr. Nagasaki was involved in numerous projects including the Trends in International Mathematics and Science Study (TIMSS), the Programme for International Student Assessment (PISA) and the Curriculum Implementation Survey. Recently, he attended the 12th International Congress on Mathematical Education in 2012 as a guest speaker and gave a presentation on “Mathematical Literacy for Living in the 21st Century.”

Currently, Mr. Nagasaki is a member of the Science Council of Japan, a fellow of the Center for Science Communication of the Japan Science and Technology Agency, a director of the Japan Textbook Research Center, an honorary member of the National Institute for Educational Policy Research and a national expert committee member of the TIMSS.
